eRecruitment: extending service to internal clients - Jeanette Devon, Deakin University

Deakin University have been running eRecruitment since late 2005. This has reduced a significant amount of manual effort, improved the quality of applications and made the process more open for HR and line managers. A key benefit has been steam-lining the workflow throughout the organisation. What lessons were learnt and where to now?

Hand over the reins: empowering line managers - Andrew Smee, Charles Sturt University

With staff and managers now comfortable with a web interface to HR and payroll, this provides a whole raft of opportunities for management reporting. This includes accessing key data about leave, pay, significant events, workforce planning and so on. To engage the managers in delivering the information, what's in the mix – kiosk, email notifications and Oracle Discoverer.

Lessons learnt implementing Employee Self Service - Sherri Shakespeare, Department of the Attorney General, WA

The Department of the Attorney General, WA implemented WSS in 8.06, moved to 8.07 and have since gone live on V10. On the way they met challenges from firewalls, the need to clean up data and issues with their organisational structure. The experience was generally positive and the lessons learnt valuable. HES R&D initiatives - Kent Levander, HES

In 2007 and 2008, HES and the HRIS Group are undertaking 13 significant R&D projects to improve Alesco functionality. Kent will explain the overall process using changes to 'Email' functionality as the example and then will cover other topical subjects such as data integrity, ESS, workflow. and changes to GL.
